The Cook County Sheriff's Prescription Drug Take Back Program provides a free service for collecting unused and expired prescription drugs from Cook County residents by authorization of the Cook County Board of Commissioners. The Sheriff's take Back Program has been in operation since 2012 at the direction of the Cook County Sheriff. The program has operated with the approval of the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency (Region V) since its inception. It is free, safe and responsible. We do not accept liquid medications or medical devices or paraphernalia.
